

Alan Turing: Convicted for gross indecency

DR NORMAN ROUTLEDGE:

Well in the post there was this letter from Manchester and it was from Alan and it came, I may say, as a great surprise to me. Because although I'd realised that he was gay – and indeed one of his boyfriends used to come to lectures with me – I didn't know that he went picking up rough trade in the streets and getting involved with the police. So I was rather startled.

My dear Norman. I've now got myself into the kind of trouble that I've always considered to be quite a possibility for me, though I'd have usually rated it at about 10 to one against.
