



Video transcript for 'What Are Variables?'

It uses something called **variables**! Take your nuts for example.

Variables are like a box that a computer can use to store useful information... such as how many friends are at your party!

And every time you bury up a new nut, we change the number in the variable.

That way if you've forgotten where your nuts are you'll be able to find out straight away how many you have, and where to find them!
