Migration is the movement of people from one location to another. **Push** factors are the reasons why people leave an area and **pull** factors are the reasons why people move to a particular area.

Migration is generally the result of several different push and pull factors. In LEDCs the movement is usually from the countryside to the towns and cities. This is called rural-urban migration.
