Year 3 Subtracting Money Lesson Guidance

Learning Outcomes and Glossary

Learning Objective

• Your child will learn how to subtract money efficiently when there is no decimal included.

Glossary

- **Pounds and pence** Throughout this resource money is referred to as pounds and pence separately. This is because children are first introduced to money with the two element separated in this way in year 3. E.g. £3.20 would be written as £3 and 20p.
- **Part-whole model** A part whole model shows a total amount (whole) and two parts that can be added to equal the value of the whole. This is shown in the video for this lesson.
- **Number line** A number line is a resource used to show addition or subtraction in 'jumps' of set amounts.

Video – Subtracting Money

- The aim of this video is to show how to subtract money using coins, a number line and column methods.
- It might be helpful for children to use real money (if possible) or to make or use play money if you do not have the correct real coins and notes.
- Throughout the video, there are a number of questions for children to answer. You will need to pause the video at these points to allow children to answer.
