

Responsible or not?

Using the **scenarios** below, have a think about which of the children's actions are **responsible** and which are **not**.

On a separate sheet of paper, you could create a table with two columns - **responsible** and **not responsible** and place each scenario in the column that you think is right.



When finished, **discuss** your ideas with your friends.

Scenarios:

1. **Sabin** is in the park with her friend who throws her crisp packet on the floor. **Sabin** politely reminds her "That's not good for our local environment" and asks her friend to pick it up.
2. **Freya** is new to town and decides to join the local netball team to make friends. **Ariana** is the team captain and notices that no one has spoken to Freya since she arrived. She decides to ask Freya if she would like to be her partner for the next exercise.
3. **Noah** sees a boy vandalising the climbing frame at his local playground. He gets angry and pushes the boy over.
4. **Amir** and his family have just finished their breakfast. Last week, Amir agreed to help his dad with some household chores but, now he notices that he has made a bit of a mess when eating and decides he can't be bothered to help clean up.
5. An old man is finding it hard to get down the steps to the local high street. **Jessica** asks if he would like a hand and he says yes. She offers her arm and walks him down the steps.
