

# Let's make a bauble from a jar lid & scrap cardboard box



## HANDY HINTS/TOP TIPS

- Scrap card can also be used as a paint palette
- Whilst waiting for bits to dry, why not have a go at one of the other festive activities
- Have some kitchen roll to hand when painting



When using scissors, make sure you have an adult to help you.

## YOU WILL NEED

### Materials:

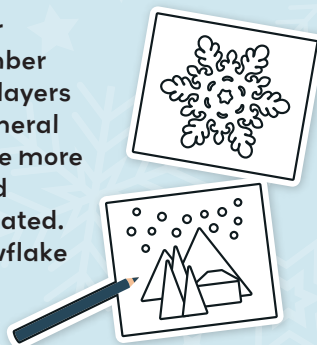
- Jar lids - larger ones make this task a little easier
- Scrap cardboard box
- Festive ribbon or string
- Pencil
- Paper
- Craft glue and sticky tape
- Glitter
- Paint - white

### Equipment:

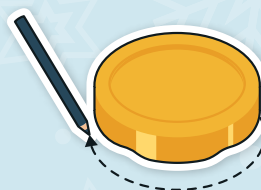
- Brushes
- Water pot
- Scissors



**1** Sketch out your design - remember you are working with layers and textures. As a general rule, the bauble will be more successful if you avoid making it too complicated. Maybe a simple snowflake would work well, or a snowy scene.



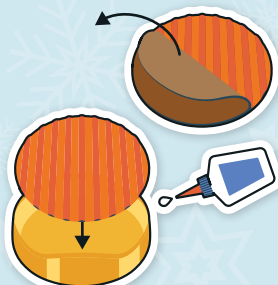
**2** Draw round your lid and cut out the circle inside the line - check to see if it fits snugly inside your lid.



**3** Use the first circle as a template and cut out another three cardboard circles.



**4** Take one of your circles and peel off a layer to reveal the wavy section, this makes an effective base layer. Stick to the inside of lid. This will be the wintry sky.



**5** On the second circle draw and cut out your large hills. On the third circle, draw and cut out some smaller hills.



**6** Paint your hills using white paint for the snowy peaks. You can also add glitter!



**7** Whilst your pieces are drying, select your ribbon, make a loop and stick to the back of the lid.



**8** Once the paint and glitter has dried, use a thin layer of glue to stick the layers inside the lid to create your design.

Your Christmas tree will look great with your bauble on. Why not make some more?
